PROFESSIONAL CREDENTIALS

ÁRPÁD BALÁZS



Perhaps the greatest honor a composer may have, is to be a part of one of his son's film scores. And, for Árpád, it has occurred twice.

At the 89th Academy Awards Ceremony, *Sing* (Kristóf Deák, dir.), was presented with the Oscar for Best Live Action Short Film. The composer for the film was the distinguished Ádám Balázs. Included in the score was a famous and significant Hungarian children's' song "Elderflower (Bodzavirág)," composed by Ádám's father, Árpád Balázs.

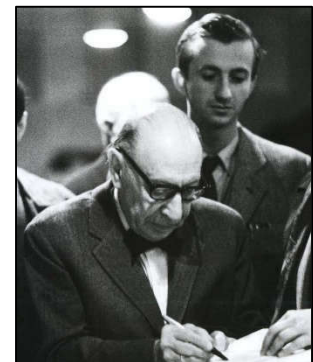
And, in 2020, Árpád and Ádám co-composed "Miserere mei, Deus," that was included in Adam's film score for *Spirál* (Cecilia Felméri, dir.).

Born in Hungary, Árpád graduated from the Franz Liszt Academy of Music (Budapest) in 1964, and was a student of Ferenc Farkas. This was followed by studies at Aram Khachaturian's masterclass in 1967. In 1970, he was then the recipient of a scholarship to study with Goffredo Petrassi—one of the most influential Italian composers of the 20th century—in Rome.

As a freelance artist, Árpád received many prestigious recognitions. From 1973 to 1990, he was a member of the Bureau of the Hungarian Composers Association, where he was a Department Secretary, followed by Department President.

Between 1985 and 1990, Árpád was Vice-President of KÓTA, the Hungarian Association of Choirs and Orchestras. In 1990, he was the founding president of the Hungarian Blind Association, and after 1998, he became President Emeritus.

In 1996, together with 14 renowned associates, he founded the Hungarian Art Workshop. He led the Hungarian section of the World Music Association for ten years, to include international competitions at Brescia, Le Havre, Corciano-Perugia, Athens, Jastrzebie Zdroj. He became a permanent jury member and taught several master classes as a visiting professor at Palermo, Gorizia, Pardubice. In 2002 he was elected a regular member of the European Academy of Science and Arts, Salzburg.

In 1969 he won the SZOT prize, and in 1970, he was awarded the Erkel Award, the Distinguished Artist Award in 1981, the Presidential Golden Medal in 2000, the MSZOSZ Prize in 2001 and the Hungarian Heritage Prize in 2002. In the spring of 2002, in recognition of his outstanding creative work, he was elected a full member of the European Academy of Sciences and Arts in Salzburg.

The towns of Letenye and Kiskunfélegyháza, presented him with the Honorary Citizen Award in 2002. And, in 2019, Árpád was presented with perhaps the most prestigious recognition of his work in the arts and with children. A school was named for him—The Balázs Árpád Elementary School for the Arts—in Kiskunfélegyháza.

Árpád has won more than 50 awards in his domestic and international competitions. Among these are the top ten prizes awarded by the International Association of Radio and Television Associations, including Budapest, Prague, Karlovy Vary, Helsinki, Berlin, Moscow and Sofia. For three years he composed for and directed the Hungarian Broadcasting Television's highly acclaimed series of music programs, *Hang-sórozó*. In the 70s and 80s, he was the artistic director for the

professional preparation and conducting of national children's orchestra festivals – Vác, Veszprém, Zánka. In addition to the jury of the events, the youth repertoire was enriched with new string and wind instrumental ensembles.

Árpád composed seven musical stage works, two oratorios, twelve cantatas, fifteen orchestral pieces, over two hundred choirs, stringers, chamber music, movie soundtracks, stage accompaniments, folk songwriting and pedagogical pieces, and three pedagogical books on music subjects.

Among his repertoire, there are four solo works of art and 50 domestic and foreign audio tracks. There are countless radio and Television recordings made of Árpád's works. In addition to Editio Musica in Budapest, several foreign publishers have also released his pieces, including such noted companies as Boosey and Hawkes (London-New York), Edizioni Suvini Zerboni (Milan), Shawnes Press Inc. (Pennsylvania), W.I.B.C. Publishing (Portland), Muzicsna Ukraina (Kiev), Izdatelstvo Muzika (Moscow), Latvian "Liesma" and Musikhojskolens Forlag (Denmark).

Árpád and his wife, Ágnes, reside in Budapest, Hungary.
